- 1886** – Korea's first modern educational institute for women (Ewha Haktang)
- 1887** – Korea's first women-only hospital (Po Goo Nyo Goan)
- 1903** – Korea's first nursing education course
- 1910** – Korea's first college-level courses for women
- 1914** – Korea's first kindergarten as a formal education institution
- 1915** – Korea's first private professional teacher training institution
- 1925** – Korea's first institute for female higher education (Ewha College)
- 1946** – Korea's first university to obtain government accreditation
- 1950** – Korea's first graduate school for women
- 1951** – Korea's first private college of education
- 1969** – Korea's first natural history museum
- 1971** – Korea's first international summer college (Summer School)
- 1977** – Asia's first women's studies course
- 1982** – Korea's first women's studies and Korean studies departments
- 1993** – Korea's first Graduate School of Social Welfare
- 1996** – Korea's first women's College of Engineering and College of Law
- 2006** – Korea's first bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degree courses with full scholarship programs for outstanding female students from developing countries (Ewha Global Partnership Program, EGPP)
- 2006** – Korea's sole exchange program partner with Harvard University
- 2007** – Korea's first open-major program (Scranton Honors Program) and Scranton College
- 2010** – Korea's first women's university to earn AACSB accreditation in all areas of the business curriculum
- 2011** – Korea's first university to host an R&D center for a global company (Solvay)
- 2012** – Korea's first university with a non-degree program for non-governmental female activists from Asia and Africa (Ewha Global Empowerment Program, EGEP)
- 2012** – Korea's first university with an overseas social welfare center (Cambodia)
- 2015** – Korea's first university to launch Division of Brain and Cognitive Sciences
- 2015** – Asia's first partner institution of the Henry Luce Foundation in the United States
- 2018** – Korea's first major university to introduce integrated admissions through regular recruitment (HOKMA College of General Education)
- 2022** – Korea's first university to establish a specialized university program for confluence analysis of Weather and Climate Data

Harvard Undergraduates in Asia Program (HUAP)

Harvard Undergraduates in Asia Program (HUAP) is a student-run academic and cultural conference. The conference aims to foster future Asia-focused leaders by building an international network through academic and cultural exchange between students from Harvard University and partner universities across Asia.

It consists of two parts: the first part invites selected students from Asian universities to Harvard University, and the second part involves Harvard students visiting partner universities in Asia. Ewha has been taking part in HUAP since 2007 as the first and only partner of Harvard in Korea. Seoul conference is held in March and Boston conference is held in January.

Global Student Partnership (GSP)

Global Student Partnership (GSP) is a student-run academic and cultural conference co-hosted by Ewha Womans University and a partner university with the aim of nurturing global leaders to have a deep understanding of two partner countries. The program proceeds in two phases, consisting of one week conference at each institution. Ewha-CUHK GSP has kicked off in 2019 and students participate in Seoul conference in July and Hong Kong conference in August.

Student Exchange and Visiting Student Program

Ewha conducts international exchange programs with prestigious universities around the world. Each year, over 800 students from more than 30 countries visit Ewha to experience Ewha’s leading global infrastructure and quality education.

Eligibility

- Full time male and female undergraduate/graduate students in an accredited university or equivalent
- Students who have completed at least one semester at home university (minimum cumulative GPA: 2.5/4.0 (75/100))
- Students with language ability to take courses in either English or Korean (Language proficiency test score not required)
